DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Our Loved Ones is a that deals with dark film subject matter and vet celebrates life in so doing. It is the story of a family shaken by tragedy, the tremors of which will be felt for several decades. It is also and above all a story of the great love between father and a daughter, David and Laurence.

David is a man who has everything one needs to be happy: a lovely wife, beautiful children, a good career. And vet, he carries within him a dull invisible. sorrow. an penetrating wound he cannot explain. He is a fragile being, melancholy and tormented. He has difficulty putting down roots, as if panicked by the cruelly ephemeral nature of everything around him.

With Our Loved Ones I wanted to say something tender and nuanced about the kind of people for whom life doesn't go without saying, those whose spirits feel out of tune, who are too sensitive for this world.

David's love for his family is infinite - his wife and children save him, help him to reconcile with life. He'd give anything for them. Beneath her parents' tender gaze, Laurence grows from a mischievous little airl into promising vouna a woman. She experiences her first loves, her first first disappointments, her failures and successes. She becomes an adult. The film has two protagonists, Laurence taking over from her father when the time comes.

Our Loved Ones is also a film about nature and wide-open spaces. I had the opportunity to shoot in my native region, the magnificent Lower St. Lawrence. In the film, nature is at once savior and threat. It is David's refuge but will also be his end. It's there he loses himself.

While Our Loved Ones tells the story of David's suffering, it first and foremost tells that of his daughter Laurence's recovery, she who chooses life. It is a family film, one I hoped would be both tender and cruel, happy and sad, bright, nostalgic and generous.

This film has been brewing inside me for almost fifteen years. It tells a story that is in many respects quite similar to my own, and speaks of characters very dear to my heart. I am happy that this film exists today.

I see it as a testimony to life, redemption, and beauty.

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
