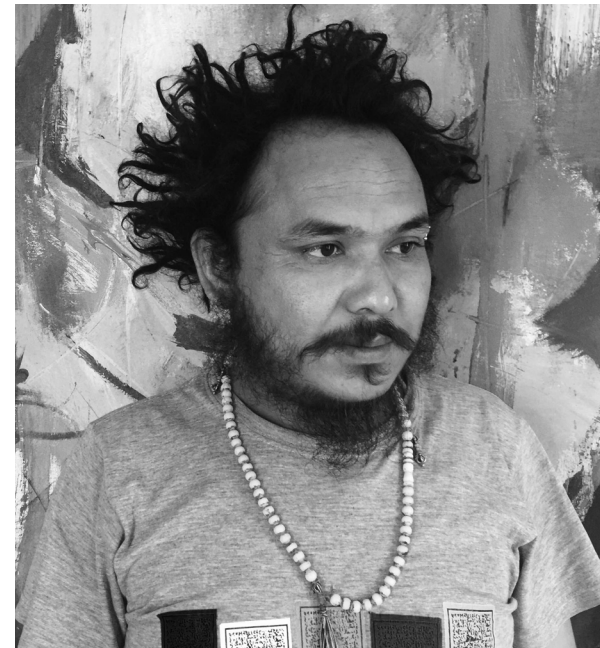


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DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY:

An award-winning young filmmaker from Nepal, born on 1984, Min Bahadur Bham graduated in Nepali Literature and Filmmaking and has a Post Graduate Degree in Buddhist Philosophy and Political Science. His short film *The Flute* (2012) made history in his country, being the first Nepali film presented at the Venice Film Festival and won Jury Award at Toronto Nepali Film Festival. Min Bahadur Bham participated in the Berlinale Talent Campus and attended the Asian Film Academy at the Busan International Film Festival in 2013 where he was awarded The Outstanding Fellow Award. *Kalo Pothi* is his debut film and the first Nepali long-feature film presented in Venice.

Min Bahadur Bham is a President of the Independent Film Society of Nepal, and is an Assistant Professor in Oscar College of Film Studies. He owns a production company, Shooney Films, Nepal where he has produced short and feature films that were screened at film festivals around the world including Busan, Seattle, and Montreal.



SHOONEY FILMS

SHOONEY FILMS, is a production company making its way by focusing on art house cinemas and aimed to work with talented filmmakers of Nepal. Several short and feature films made by this company are selected in various film festivals including Venice, Busan, Clermont Ferrand, Fribourgetc.

This company produced around 3 dozen feature films including some documentaries, which were widely acclaimed and received awards in the major film festivals including Cannes, Berlin, and Venice, etc. One of the company's most recent significant work, Rithy Panh's *THE MISSING PICTURE* garnered the Un certain regard Award at the Cannes Film Festival and was Academy Award nominated for Best Foreign Language Film in 2014.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT:

I was born in a remote village in Northern Nepal. I grew up to the smell of alpine trees, the sight of fresh, lush meadows, and the touch of the cold Himalayan breeze. With the beauty of my surroundings was a darker aspect of my childhood and of the communities living in that part of the world. Shackled by poverty, illiteracy and taboos, we live in a society that is deeply split by caste and class divides. So, it wasn't easy having to accept the fact that I wasn't allowed to play with my best friend only because he belonged to a lower caste.

And that is the heart of the film's subject matter – a true story of two best friends growing up on in a segregated society during the Maoist insurgency. This story is about the complexities of friendship and our society, a factual reflection of the archaic practices that still prevail in Nepal.

Today, years later, my past still haunts me. As a filmmaker it is crucial for me to bring out my true own life experiences to the world.
